

"I remember one incident which stands out very vividly and it is this: At the time of the Christian Science World-Wide meeting in the summer of 1984, I remember being in the arena auditorium in Milwaukee. A busload of First Church of Christ Scientist of Madison members came to Milwaukee for this meeting. There were a few state-wide places having this video broadcast.

As we filed in to take our seats, I was fortunate enough to be sitting behind our dear teacher, Mr. Muth. When he noticed us coming in he turned around and greeted us warmly. In further conversation with him, he stated that this meeting would not be in accordance with Mrs. Eddy's concept of how to reach people and further the cause of Christian Science. The title of this meeting was "To Live For All Mankind", and it was a video broadcast going out to world-wide locations on quite a large screen as I recall. The main thrust was to go out into the community and be active in events that would acquaint people with Christian Science. I remember our church formed an Outreach Committee after this meeting where each of us had a particular assignment.

Now this to me was the important part of the day. While visiting with our dear teacher, he told a small group of us sitting in back of his row of a dynamic healing. He had been called to a hospital by a couple who attended a Christian Science church. Their daughter had been taken there by ambulance after being hit by a car while she was riding a bicycle. Mr. Muth arrived apparently just after a medical doctors had come out and said that the girl had passed on. The parents were distraught. Mr. Muth calmed them and asked if they wanted him to go in to be with her. They replied "By all means". Mr. Muth did go into the girl's room and stayed and worked and prayed he said for 15 to 30 min. The girl did revive and then he called the parents. You can imagine their reaction. The girl continued to progress and in a short while she was able to be taken home. Mr. Muth said he visited the child a few times during the next week or so and gave her treatment. She continued to return to normal activities. All was well thereafter. To the small group of us sitting there we were awestruck. He told us that this work would and should continue to be entirely natural as Mrs. Eddy had proved it to be.

Another time, when we (the last Association Board before Mr. Muth's passing) were meeting at his house. We were making decisions regarding the Association meeting for that year. We got to talking about how malicious malpractice seemed to be trying diminish the Christian Science movement. He stated very emphatically "Make no mistake, Mrs. Eddy is on the field of battle." I still hear his words ringing in my ears that day.

I can also remember him telling us in class that if Christian Science were ever to be lost to the world, it would not happen from without, but from within.
