

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man are fully known and acknowledged" (S&H 226). America, properly conceived, is a wholly spiritual idea.

"THE LAND OF CHRISTIAN SCIENCE WHERE FETTERS FALL..."

The Holy Bible is a spiritual odyssey from the Garden of Eden (Genesis) to the City of God (Revelation). All Christians, and all mortals, whether they know it or not, aspire to this wholly spiritual consciousness, which is the City of God. It is now beginning to be understood that this wholly spiritual consciousness is also known as America.

The five Books of Moses (Genesis through Deuteronomy) spell out the conditions for starting on the journey to the City of God; the holy prophets expound and reinforce that instruction; and Jesus and the great Apostles, Paul and John, uplift, enlighten, and instruct us further as to how to find and enter this wholly spiritual consciousness, or City of God.

Mary Baker Eddy explains this City of God as "that consciousness which God bestows," or a wholly spiritual consciousness. Some of Mrs. Eddy's early students

saw with her that this wholly spiritual consciousness could also be termed
America.

The Old Testament, or Holy Scriptures, is filled with the divine adventures

of the Children of Israel, their travail, their hopes, their disappointments, their disabedience— but over it all is the clear voice of God, speaking first to the patriarchs, then to Moses, next to a few of the kings, especially King David, "the sweet psalmist of Israel," and finally to the holy prophets. When contending with the repeated disabedience of the Children of Israel, Moses, before entering the Promised Land, conferred with the Lord:

The land, which we passed through to search it, is an exceeding good land.

If the Lord delight in us, then he will bring us into this land, and give it us; a land which floweth with milk and honey.

Only rebel not ye against the Lord, neither fear ye the people of the land...

But all the congregation bade stone them [Joshua and Caleb] with stones. And the glory of the Lord appeared in the tabernacle of the congregation before all the children of Israel.

And the Lord said unto Moses, How long will this people provoke me? and how long will it be ere they believe me, for all the signs which I have shewed among them?...

And the Lord said,...as truly as I live, all the earth shall be filled with the glory of the Lord. (Numbers 14:7-11,20,21)

This millennial estate or spiritual consciousness, or *Promised Land*, is surely "the land of Christian

Science, where fetters fall and the rights of man are fully known and acknowledged." The "glory of the Lord" which shall fill

this land is the light of that Mind "which was also in Christ Jesus," the illumination of Soul which is the true life and spirit and intelligence of all men.

Also recorded in the Books of Moses, are God's strong warnings concerning worldly concessions: "Thou shalt make no covenant with them [the people and ways of the world]" (Deut 7:2). But Moses was aware of the fallibility of his followers: "For I know thy rebellion...behold, while I am yet alive with you this day, ye have been rebellious against the Lord; and how much more after my death?" (Deut 31:27). But Moses always concluded that "Thou shalt therefore keep the commandments,...And he will love thee, and bless thee,...And the Lord will take away from thee all sickness" (Deut 7:11,13,15). A glowing promise indeed!

In these Latter Days when the medical thought seems overwhelming in our society and in the world, the Bible promises loom larger, seem stronger, and forever hold up the assurance of the rewards of obedience. The truths of the Holy Bible stand forever—punishing sin (worldly mindedness and sensuality) and rewarding sinlessness (freedom from the action of the human mortal mind) with health, harmony, activity, and life eternal.

One of Mary Baker Eddy's closest students, Augusta Stetson, took the Bible promises literally and with great earnestness. She

saw that the Promised Land was also the same "land of Christian Science, where fetters fall and the

rights of man are fully known and acknowledged," spoken of by her Leader and Teacher, Mary Baker Eddy, in Science and Health. She saw that this land is America, "the land of the free and the home of

the brave." She became more and more convinced that the term America refers to a wholly spiritual state of consciousness, even as does the *Promised Land*. They are one and the same. In speaking of this to a correspondent, Mrs. Stetson said:

Since coming into Christian Science, and sitting at the feet of my Teacher and Leader, Mary Baker Eddy, I have learned the absolute and unimpeachable integrity and perfectibility of the universe, including men—not the carnal, flesh man, but spiritual man, whom God created in His own image.

I am thoroughly convinced, that America is the place, chosen of God and His Christ, wherein to develop, expand and teach this pure Science of Christ, for the "salvation of the

world from error, sin, disease and death" (Mary Baker Eddy, in *Unity of Good*, p. 177). America may be likened to a college—the *spiritual* college for all the earth—and those desiring to enter therein, must pass the required entrance examination, namely, acknowledgment of God and of Christ, God's Son, and unreserved loyal obedience to the Constitution of the United States of America, and to American ideals of liberty, freedom of religion, freedom of speech and of the press. The Pilgrim Fathers and Mothers established on these shores the spiritual and religious tradition of America....America will finally be revealed to our spiritual senses as heaven. (Correspondence With a Jewish Leader, by Augusta E. Stetson)

Our great Leader, Mary Baker Eddy, summarizes the whole issue of the reign of Christ on earth, typified as "the glory of the Lord" revealed to Moses, in the following words:

Loyal Christian Scientists, be of good cheer: the night is far spent, the day dawns; God's universal kingdom will appear, Love will reign in every heart, and *His* will be done on earth as in heaven. (Mis 213:27)

The millennium is a state and stage of mental ad-

vancement, going on since ever time was. Its impetus, accelerated by the advent of Christian Science, is marked, and will increase till all men shall know Him (divine Love) from the

THE GREAT LITIGATION

#### PART II

[The following article has been excerpted from Studdert-Kennedy's book *Christian Science and Organized Religion* and is a continuation of Part I which appeared in our November, 1993 issue.]

BOTH sides...retained distinguished counsel, but the Trustees...evidently determined that they would secure the most eminent possible. They retained Charles Evans Hughes, who was to become Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court, as their leading counsel.

Viewing the whole matter's as I have endeavored to do from the standpoint of judicial detachment, two facts seem to stand out

with special significance: first, that in contrast

to the situation on the other side, none of the counsel employed by the Trustees was a Christian Scientist; and, second, that in spite of this fact, before the long trial was over the counsel for the Trustees, one and all, displayed in their speeches and in their whole attitude in court an admiration and respect for the character, wisdom, and high prophetic vision of Mrs. Eddy which were evidently quite unfeigned.

Broadly speaking the Bill in Equity maintained this thesis. It maintained that Mrs. Eddy, recogniz-

ing the inherent tendency MRS. EDDY ESTABLISH- of the human mind towards domination...determined to offset this tendency so far as she possibly could. To this end she established in the Christian Science

organization two separate and distinct authorities. If she had intended that there should be only one, nothing would have been easier than so to arrange it. ...With a "supreme authority" already in existence some six years or more- for the contention of the Directors was and is that under Mrs. Eddy they were supreme from the first-Mrs. Eddy deliberately went out of her way to create another authority, to establish it by law as a "perpetual and irrevocable Trust and confidence," and to stipulate that its members should carry on the business of the Trust strictly "upon their own responsibility,"...and be alone responsible for "all pamphlets, tracts, and other literature pertaining to said business, using their best judgment as to the means of preparing and issuing same." In brief, everything about this Deed of Trust, its wording, its underscoring, its interlineations, go to show that the donor, Mrs. Eddy, was desirous of making it as absolute and final as she pos-- sibly could and to consti-

ENTIRE COURT PROCEED-tute the Trustees as absolute in their own well-de-INGS PUBLISHED scribed and circumscribed field as they possibly

could be made.

Such was the contention of the Bill in Equity.

By mutual agreement between the counsel for the Directors and the counsel for the Trustees, The Christian Science Monitor undertook to publish the entire court proceedings each day, a complete stenographic report without note or comment, and this agreement was loyally adhered to by the Trustees.

It was a tremendous task, and one that has never before or since been undertaken by any newspaper. ...

For thirty-four days, spreading through June, July, August, and September, was unfolded through countless different ways an elaborate judicial process which was quickly seen to envisage not merely a question of authority between two

conflicting powers, but the much deeper question as to whether the world was yet ready to recognize the possibility of government by Principle, rather than by persons.

To me, as I have read the vast record with its voluminous correspondence; its historic documents; its books; declarations and sworn affidavits; the mental struggle of the race toward a higher plane of thought and government which it represents has always seemed remarkable. For it needs to be remembered that here was no hole-in-the-corner business but, in the last analysis, an open debate between some of the great-

est minds in the country as to whether the ideal of individual self-government upon which the whole history of America rests, could or could not, at this present day and age,

"move on to perfection" in the recognition of government by Principle. Charles Evans Hughes and his associates believed that it could and should. ...

Finally, on September 12, the case rested...until the middle of the following February, when after months of careful judgment the Master's decision was formulated and finally handed down.

This decision proved to be in favor of the Trustees,

both in fact and in law.

It would not be, I think, an exaggeration to say that the effect of this decision upon the Christian Science organization, a decision which endorsed the position taken up by the Trustees in every particular

and denied final authority to the Board of Directors. was at first one of bewilderment. It was entirely - unexpected. The bewilder-

ment, however, proved to be only a very passing phase. It was quickly followed by a reaction distinctly favorable to the Directors. ...

To come by any just estimate of the drama and importance of this great case, probably one of the most important—certainly one of the most dramatic that has ever come up for judgment in the courts of the United States, it is necessary to realize the deeply vital nature, to great numbers of people, of the issues involved. The issues of Christian Science have this difference over many other issues for those really interested, that is literally a lifeor-death matter. Christian Science- there is no gain-

saying it—enters into every moment of the lives of its adherents and the keynote of its teaching is MOMENT OF OUR LIVES. harmony. The way in which this harmony was achieved in the circumstances under

consideration has already been shown. In the vast majority of cases the Board of Directors was enthroned as the final authority, and all the so-called loyalty and implicit obedience which used to be accorded Mrs. Eddy, often to her sorrow in her lifetime, was transferred on her death to that Board. Loyalty to the Board of Directors was elevated to a point where it became the outstanding symbol of harmony.

When, therefore, the Board of Trustees of the Christian Science Publishing Society finally, on the 25th of March, 1919, filed their Bill in Equity in the Supreme Court of Massachusetts, praying the protection of the Court in the exercise of their Trust

from interference by the Board of Directors, and secured from the Court a temporary injunction to that end, the first reaction of the Field was one of horror and dismay. To challenge the Board of Directors was bad enough. The inference to be drawn from this was worse. Vast numbers of Christian Scientists had

come, in spite of themselves and their sober better judgment, to regard Boston as some holy city, and everyone in any way connected with the work at "Headquarters" as in some

way superior and blessed. Harmony, complete and undisturbed, was the imagined, always prevailing condition at Boston, and loyalty to the Board of Directors, and again loyalty, was the earnestly demanded and cheerfully accorded status.

Into the midst of this settled calm, out of a blue sky came the thunderbolt of the Bill in Equity. It literally carried consternation into the midst of hundreds and thousands of lives throughout the world.

THE BILL IN FQUITY WAS A THUNDERBOLT.

The Movement was swept, without warning, by a sense of failure so poignant as to be intolerable ... It was so intolerable that, with most Christian Scientists, the way was chosen which afforded an immediate solution. There could be no delay; there could be no moment when "authority" could be in doubt, when there could be any question of sides. And so, while...there was in every church throughout the world a certain number who refused to decide at once, the majority of Christian Scientists did so decide and, as in the case of any war throughout the history of the world, they began to heap upon the head of "the enemy" every manner of reproach in the broadest sense of the word. ...

The methods today may not be the methods of former times; there may be no stake or gibbet or whipping post, but the condemnation is the same and the same "lust to annihilate" lies behind it. ...

A great mass of literature sent out about this time lies before me. It makes amazing reading. Most of it, apparently, emanated from adherents of the Directors.

Meanwhile, side by side with this great national effort there went forward in every church and society throughout the world a local canvass and round-up of

A RELIGIOUS PER-SECUTION UNSEEN FOR 200 YEARS dissenters, the like of which has certainly never been seen in any religious body for two hundred years. Boards of Directors of local Christian Science churches devised question-

aires for their members, and when "satisfactory" answers were not forthcoming further inquiries were made, leading, in the majority of cases, to a formal trial followed, if not by dismissal from membership, certainly by dismissal from office.

The Master's findings were handed down on February 20, 1920. On March 6, the Board of Directors [appealed the decision and] sent out a circular letter to all the members of the Mother Church:... "Much of the report is unfavorable, but it is not a final decision; it is subject to review by the Supreme Judicial Court of Massachusetts"...

The justices of the Supreme Court of Massachusetts

read the newspapers....
Every effort, therefore,
was made by means of open
letters, pamphlets, replies, and counter replies
to make clear to all and

sundry that the Christian Science organization stood solidly behind the Board of Directors, and that if the Supreme Court of Massachusetts was entertaining a single thought otherwise it would, before the organization was through with it, be without excuse.

In writing this book, I have bound this statement ["Mere historic incidents and personal events are frivolous and of no moment unless they illustrate the ethics of Truth."M.B.E., Ret.] on my forehead as a veritable phylactery, and have used it inexorably

as the acid test. I have, moreover, taken the phrase, "ethics of Truth," in its highest and broadest meaning. I have endeavored always to spell "Truth" as Mrs. Eddy spells it, with a capital. ...

Charles Evans Hughes' final argument...already regarded as one of the great legal documents of the century...may yet become a landmark in the religious history of the race...

HUGHES' ARGUMENT MAY BECOME LANDMARK IN RELIGIOUS HISTORY

From first to last, Mr. Hughes' argument is based on first principles; and, while adhering closely to the legal and the lawful, shows how both these can be used and were, indeed, used by a lone New England woman to lead the human mind out of the tangled web of organization, of meat and drink and holy days and sabbath days, into the infinite mathematics of pure Spirit where Principle governs and cannot do otherwise.

It was, however, in his complete grasp of the struggle Mrs. Eddy was evidently waging through her Trust Deed against the "powers of autocracy" and of the new foundation in the art of government that she was seeking to lay, that Mr. Hughes' arguments are, I think, destined to take a place all their own in the annals of human progress.

Those who were present have recorded how a strange hush fell over the crowded courtroom as Mr. Hughes came to this part of his speech: "A good deal has

been said with respect to the importance of harmony. No one could dispute the desireability of harmony. But there are two conceptions of harmony. One is the harmony produced by despotic power; the other is the harmony that results from a unity of ideas and common views of religious truth. It seems to us most unjust to Mrs. Eddy, most contrary to her teachings, to assume for a moment that she relied upon the exercise of the despotic power..."

Mr. Hughes then went on to maintain that although

Mrs. Eddy made use of organization and saw to it that organization should be as perfect as possible, none the less "her confidence was in the truth as she conceived it and taught it."

"She believed," Mr. Hughes continued, "that that truth would have a harmonizing power, that it would bring all those devoted to the truth, as she taught it, together in a unity of action, not through forms of organization; in fact, it seems to me and I submit that when with her knowledge of these Directors, and having already constituted them trustees of the real estate under the deed of 1892 she selected another Board of Trustees under the deed of 1898 for the publishing power, it was because she feared the autocracy that might result if the entire power of organization was in one hand..."

SUPREME COURT
UPHELD MASTER'S
FINDINGS

The Supreme Court of Massachusetts upheld the Master's findings of fact in every particular, that the Trustees had been faithful to their trust and that they had managed it honest-

ly, successfully, and disinterestedly. The Court, however, was inclined to admit this other law to which the Directors and their supporters had appealed, this ecclesiastical law...At any rate it was an ecclesiastical matter and it was not for the Court to sit in judgment on ecclesiastical matters.

The Court, therefore, would wash its hands of the whole question by declaring that final power of removal did rest with the Board of Directors...Thus was the case decided.

It has been no part of my concern to prove anyone right or show anyone wrong, but only to trace, so far as I could, that steady unfoldment of a wider concept which must necessarily express itself "through persons, places, and things."...My main purpose all along has been, I think, made clear. It is not to show that the Trustees were right and the Directors wrong on the great issues involved, but to show that the course taken by the Directors, the attempt to establish and perpetuate in a purely spirit-

ual movement material and personal dominance and direction, inevitably resulted in just the situation which ultimately obtained, namely, the rebellion of the Trustees, their defeat, and the secret of final victory which emerges from this defeat. But this victory is not and can never be the victory of a person nor of an institution, but merely that of a right idea finally establishing itself in the hearts of men.

#### INDIVIDUALITY VERSUS PERSONALITY

CHRIST Jesus represented the fatherhood of God... At the ascension, when he knew that he was losing the material sense...he told his disciples he was about to leave them (as a physical visible personality); but that he (his invisible divine personality or individuality...) would never leave them... Had they risen with him, they would have continued conscious of his presence...

Our dearly loved Leader discerned the presence of Christ. To her was given the cup which she must drink, if she would follow Christ, and lift a sin-blind world to see the ideal man... She represents the motherhood of Love. She has called mortals to awake, and to behold the Christ-idea...

In this hour, as in the past, our Leader is guiding us to God.... I do not see her...in physical, finite form, as I once did. That sense is fading and I feel a tender presence. I hear a sweet voice saying, "This is the way, walk ye in it." Thus we find on the highway to holiness that Jesus and Mary have learned "the way," and the sons of God are coming into the kingdom of heaven on earth. Oh, the riches of this understanding! The "two witnesses are fulfilling the law of Spirit.

May we realize the second appearing of the Son of God, and appreciate our great Leader, whose ear heard Christ's impersonal call to turn from flesh and follow Spirit.

#### NOAH WEBSTER

MANY students of Christian Science have in their library a copy of *The Student's Reference Dictionary*. This volume was largely the labor of a dedicated Christian Science practitioner named Constance Fairchild Burnham. Early in the 1960's Mrs. Burnham

wrote to us: "A young girl said to me one day, 'Evi-dently the words in Science and Health don't mean the same thing to me that they do to you.' This remark set me off like a stiff breeze

shoots a sailboat ahead, and I discovered that it was all too true! Word meanings and values have been so changed that the actual sense of our books has been changed!"

This incident brought about a serious study of dictionaries and of the life and work of Noah Webster followed by the Keystone Publishers of Montana and

the aforementioned dictionary which states in the Preface: "At the time that Mrs. Eddy was writing her books the word 'semantics,' meaning 'a change in the significance of words' (Web 1939) had not yet come into common usage...,

"In order to protect Mrs. Eddy's books from semantics, which could change the spirit and essence of her words without in any way affecting the

letter, The Student's Reference Dictionary has been prepared from the Webster's in use when Mrs. Eddy was writing Science and Health." We are indebted to Mrs. Burnham's research for a good deal of the information in this article.

In 1809 Noah Webster wrote: "The Lexicographer's business is to search for Truth, to proscribe error, and repress anomaly. The compilers of dictionaries should not be dabblers in etymology as many of them have been, but men of deep research and accurate phil- "THE LEXICOGRAPHER'S ological knowledge. ... The Lexicographer should not be misled by his habits. nor biased by the caprices of eminent men." Warfel

says in his book, Noah Webster, Schoolmaster to America, "To this creed Webster remained faithful."

In the Author's Preface to An American Dictionary of the English Language, Webster's original work, we read: "If the language can be improved in regularity, so as to be more easily acquired by our own citizens and by foreigners, and thus be rendered a more useful instrument for the propagation of science, arts, civilization, and Christianity; - if it can be rescued from the mischievous influence of sciolists. and that dabbling spirit of innovation which is perpetually disturbing its settled usages and filling it with anomalies; - if in short our vernacular language can be redeemed from corruptions, and our philology and literature from degradation; it would be a source of great satisfaction to me to be one among

the instruments of promoting these valuable objects. If this object cannot be effected, and my wishes and hopes are to be frustrated, my labor will be lost, and this work must sink into oblivion."

In reading Dr. Webster's article, "The Origin of Language," it becomes clear to the student seeking

webster's work rests squarely on the Scriptures and
that he discovered that
all language evolves from
the one infinite Mind which
is God. Surely God who pre-

pared a place for the Woman (Rev 12:6) also inspired Noah Webster to provide for her the tools for her great work,—as before quoted, "the language...im-proved...so as to be...a more useful instrument for the propagation of science."

Webster's work was unparalleled and its excellence was recognized at home and abroad. Every effort was made to place copies of his dictionary in every library, school, and classroom.



Their very foundation as stated on the Great Seal is "Novus Ordo Seclorum," the New Order of the Ages. The Christ idea which was persecuted and whose adherents were driven from the Old World, became the foundation stone of the New. The First Article in the Bill of Rights in our Constitution protects this divine idea with the words, "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof...".

TO ASCERTAIN THE TRUE PRINCIPLES OF THE LANGUAGE

In Noah Webster's Preface he wrote: "The United States commenced their existence under circumstances wholly novel and unexampled in the history of nations. They commenced with civili-

zation, with learning, with science, with constitutions of free government, and with that best gift of God to man, the Christian religion.

- "...It has been my aim in this work, now offered to my fellow citizens, to ascertain the true principles of the language.
- "...I spent ten years in [the] comparison of radical words, and in forming a Synopsis of the principal Words in twenty Languages, arranged in Classes under their primary Elements or Letters. The result has been to open what are to me new views of language, and to unfold what appears to be the genuine principles on which these languages are constructed."

The name Webster has practically become a synonym for an American dictionary of the English language,

and rightly so from the magnitude of his accomplishments. Many American homes today have a Webster's Dictionary, but very, very few of the owners of these "Webster" dictionaries are

aware of what malicious animal manitism has done to Noah Webster's great work. Mrs. Burnham wrote to us: "One of us asked the Merriam Webster Company when Webster's work was revised. They replied that it was never revised. It was totally removed. The letter is in our files."

Noah Webster's son-in-law, Dr. Goodrich, succeeded him as editor of "Webster's" and it remained intact until Goodrich passed away in 1864. Immediately thereafter Dr. Webster's etymology was discarded and replaced by that of Dr. C.A.F. Mahn, of Berlin, Prussia. Mahn was employed to revise completely the etymology on which Webster's Dictionary was established.

What is the basis of Dr. Mahn's etymology? It begins, according to the 1890 edition of Webster's, with the "Indian Sanskrit of the four Vedas...the sacred books of the Brahman religion; the Prokrit dialects, one of which, the Pali, is the sacred language of the Buddhists in Ceylon and Further Indian, and the Iranian,— the Zend, preserved in the sacred writings of the Parsi."

Dr. Webster knew these languages. To complete the derivation of the words comprising our English language he assigned himself the task of mastering the following more than twenty languages:

Chaldaic Samaritan Persian Armoric Dutch Greek French Portugese Syriac Hebrew Latin Anglo-Saxon Swedish Italian Russian Ethiopic Welsh Arabic Irish (Hiberno-Celtic) German Danish Sanskrit Gothic English Spanish

and the early dialects of English and German. But his labors and research strengthened the Scriptural basis of his etymology.

The two etymologies are antagonistic,— that is, Webster's based on Scripture and Mahn's with an oriental or Indo-European basis. In explanation of

the Indo-European, we read in the 1939 Webster's New International Dictionary: "In the 19th century comparative and historical study of these languages... established their descent from a common ancestor spoken in the late Stone Age...by a people of unknown...

race. This unrecorded language has been largely hypothetically reconstructed."

As before quoted Dr. Webster said of his many years of work and research: "The result has been to open

Scudder wrote in his book American Men of Letters: "All of Dr. Webster's work, as he regarded it, has been swept away."

It is difficult to find any information on Dr. Mahn at all, but the question arises,—If he was a true scholar why did he not produce his own work and let the two etymologies stand side by side? Why has his etymology been published under Webster's name thus clandestinely eliminating all of Dr. Webster's wonderful work? Why have the genuine principles of language which unfolded in Webster's work been replaced by a hypothetical reconstruction of an unrecorded language of an unknown race?

Only the Christian Scientist has any inkling to the answer to these questions. "Ever since the foundation of the world...evil has tried to slay the Lamb" (S&H 568) and to obscure the Truth.


Is it not a crime to use a man's good name, to usurp his reputation and his thriving business for the purpose of destroying his great life work? "The looms of crime, hidden in the

IN SCIENCE and Health we read, "the adamant of error, - self-will, self-justification, self-love, - which wars against spirituality and is the law of sin and death." (242:17) Self-will is the first of this triad of error warring against our spirituality. Let us see what it claims to be and how to dissolve it.

In Webster's dictionary we find for adamant, lphastone imagined by some to be of impenetrable hardness, hence now impenetrable hardness. Notice the word adam in this word. "Divide the word Adam into two syllables, and it

reads a dam, or obstruction...Here a dam...stands for obstruction, error..."(S&H 338). Dealing with self-will, or will power, then are we not dealing with an obstruction warring against our spiritual sense?

Mortal man is so egotistical, thinking he can do so much on his own. Really, "The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he seeth the Father do." (John) We cloud the vision with our sense of self-will. Our

Leader says of it in our textbook: "Will-blind, stubborn, and headlongcooperates with appetite and passion." It is "opposed to the divine Mind," "is not Science...belongs

to the so-called material senses, and its use is to be condemned." It "is sheer animal magnetism...may

infringe the rights of man...produces evil continually." It "maketh and worketh a lie, hiding the divine Principle of harmony, is destructive to health, and is the cause of disease..." "Will-power is capable

of all evil...it is the prayer of the unrighteous ... In the Glossary she says of it, "The motive power of error;...animal power...a wrong-doer." And on page 446 she tells us

that "The exercise of will brings on a hypnotic state, detrimental to health and integrity of thought."

These many statements by our Leader as to the evil of human will should alert us to the need to recognize and rise above this hypnotic state. Scripture tells us that Jesus had this sense to overcome in the Garden of Gethsemane. "And he was withdrawn from them about a stone's cast, and kneeled down, and prayed, Saying, Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me: nevertheless not my will, but thine, be done." (Luke 22:41-42, Emphasis added.)

Mrs. Eddy labeled this Gethsemane experience "The holy struggle," and wrote of it in "Atonement and Eucharist": "When the human element in him struggled with the divine, our

great Teacher said: 'Not my will but Thine be done!'

- that is, Let not the flesh, but the Spirit, be represented in me." (S&H 33:18)

Can we say the same? Are we praying daily, hourly, "Thy will be done"? Or are we outlining what we think should be done and then humanly trying to demonstrate it? "[P]rayer, coupled with a fervent habitual desire to know and do the will of God, will bring us into all Truth." (S&H 11:29) Our beautiful hymn says, "Thou wilt bind the stubborn will..." (Po 14)

The definition of adamant said, impenetrable hardness, but on page 242 our textbook gives us the solution to penetrating this error: "let us labor to dissolve with the universal solvent of Love the adamant

of error..." Truly, "Love is the liberator." (S&H) We must "Wait, and love more..." (Po 4).

In the Blue Book our Leader is quoted as saying: "I love; one will ask whom do you love? I answer, I love. What do you love? I love.

#### LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

...a holocaust has swept across Southern California where we live, and is still burning. Our own town was saved from the flames as a wall of fire approached the southern end of Hemet, - unbeknown to me, - as I maintained a prayer-vigil all night the day before, not knowing what the human need was, even, but just sensing a need. Tuesday night, October 26th, at 11 P.M. I got up and looked out the window and saw that a windstorm was coming up. I returned to bed and lay down, but prayed all night, God giving me powerful truths to work with. At 11 A.M. the next day, as I sat praying in my "prayer chair," and going to God with "the books" in hand, a wall of flames was advancing towards our town from the foothills, unbeknown to me. I just kept on praying, and was later told that the fire turned away from our town at approximately 11 A.M., and it was extinguished.

Though others may have felt this need, I alone, in our house, sensed the need to pray, and was later joined by many others, of course, as the news came out about the fires still burning across Southern California. (The red dragon trying to take control.) I am pressing on in prayer.... Awakening is what we need. - spiritual awakening.... By the way, - even though these fires have come fast and furiously, (arson, and windstorms knocking down power lines) we have not heard of any loss of life. People were able to get out in time. The instances of protection we hear of are quite outstanding, - even threatened animals remaining very calm, - as at a very large animal park in San Diego, in a natural setting in a huge acreage. The fire came right up to one gate and burned it, but the fire was put out right then and there, and the animals were very calm, - showing the power of prayer.



Yet He is here to speak to all who turn to Him in Prayer,


To Love and care for His dear ones as He loves and cares for all.
