# CHAPTER III

# MARRIAGE

What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder. In the resurrection they neither marry, nor are given in marriage, but are as the angels of God in heaven. - Jesus.

MIND Mind

THEN our great Teacher came to him for baptism, John was astounded. Reading his thoughts, Jesus 3 added: "Suffer it to be so now: for thus it becometh us to fulfil all righteousness." Jesus' concessions (in certain cases) to material methods were for the advancement of 6 spiritual good.

Spirit

Marriage is the legal and moral provision for generation among human kind. Until the spiritual creation is discerned intact, is apprehended and understood, and His kingdom is come as in the vision of the Apocalypse, — where the corporeal sense of crea-12 tion was cast out, and its spiritual sense was revealed from heaven, - marriage will continue, subject to such moral regulations as will secure increasing virtue. Soul 15 Infidelity to the marriage covenant is the social scourge

of all races, "the pestilence that walketh in darkness, . . . the destruction that wasteth at noonday." The commandment, "Thou shalt not commit adultery," is no less imperative than the one, "Thou shalt not kill."

# CHAPTER III

### MARRIAGE

As man becomes increasingly aware of his own being as a state of consciousness, he ponders this inwardly and observes its effect outwardly. He becomes aware of consciousness as a state of identity and individuality common to each and all, and having infinite diversity in range and character; also that this individual consciousness or identity is a phenomenon which logically requires its relationship with the infinite noumenon, to complete the cycle and oneness of being. This in turn brings up the fact that no-one can exist alone; that there is no isolated being; that relationship must obtain in harmony and in order, between these identities as phenomena and the one infinite noumenon or cause.

It is the work and purpose of the Bible and the Christian Science Textbook, *Science and Health*, to bring to light this supreme office of relationship, to demonstrate it and interpret it scientifically. Hence the term, Christianity, the natural consequence of the Christ, and which Christendom has taken to itself.

Thus when the creative Word or Logos is reflecting the tone of Christianity, it is relationship we are concerned with in its many phases and aspects.

It is the purpose and design of this third chapter MARRIAGE to exalt relationship in every walk of life, and primarily as it obtains between man and his Maker, for when this is in order and in harmony, the problems of daily life come within the office of law and find their solution.

It is well first to become familiar with the Genesis order of unfoldment throughout the chapter and to observe the ascending nature of the text. Secondly, to remember that the chapter as a whole in the design of the textbook corresponds to the Word reflecting Christianity, and thereby provides an approach to all that is implied by the title MARRIAGE.

Thirdly, the matrix reading provides a more detailed consideration from the operational standpoint.

The reader is now in a position to appreciate, understand, and demonstrate the diversity of office represented by the inspired text.

The words of Jesus point to the eternal fact - the oneness of Being, of Principle and idea as the divine ideal.

The human footsteps, though indispensible, as they approach resurrection are a diminishing factor until they disappear at the point of co-incidence.

IND Mind

Jesus came to John for baptism - a concession "for the advancement of spiritual good": it was a starting point. Jesus, reading John's thoughts and knowing his re-action, added "Suffer it to be so now".

WORD Word

Spirit Marriage is a similar concession, and for the present is "the legal and moral provision for generation among human kind". The text implies that when the spiritual creation is discerned intact, and understood, and His kingdom is come as in the vision of the Apocalypse, marriage will yield to spiritual being; though meanwhile "subject to such moral regulations as will secure increasing virtue". (Virtue: purity, freedom from vice — Oxford).

Soul

The text now deals with an aspect of sin — infidelity — from the standpoint of the Commandments, and by quoting the Psalmist.

Principle Chastity is the cement of civilization and progress. 1 Without it there is no stability in society, and without it one cannot attain the Science of Life. 3

Christ

Life Union of the masculine and feminine qualities constitutes completeness. The masculine mind reaches a higher tone through certain elements of the feminine, while the feminine mind gains courage and strength through masculine qualities. different elements conjoin naturally with each other, and 9 their true harmony is in spiritual oneness. Both sexes should be loving, pure, tender, and strong. The attraction between native qualities will be perpetual only as it 12 is pure and true, bringing sweet seasons of renewal like the returning spring.

Truth Beauty, wealth, or fame is incompetent to meet the 15 demands of the affections, and should never weigh against the better claims of intellect, goodness, and virtue. Happiness is spiritual, born of Truth and Love. It is unselfish; therefore it cannot exist alone, but requires all mankind to share it.

Human affection is not poured forth vainly, even Love though it meet no return. Love enriches the nature, enlarging, purifying, and elevating it. The wintry 24 Help and blasts of earth may uproot the flowers of affection, and scatter them to the winds; but this severance of fleshly ties serves to unite thought more closely to 27 God, for Love supports the struggling heart until it ceases to sigh over the world and begins to unfold its wings for 30 heaven.

Marriage is unblest or blest, according to the disappointments it involves or the hopes it fulfils. To happify Christia

Likewise, "chastity is the cement of civilization and progress". It is fore-runner to the oneness of being within Principle and fore-shadows the Science of Life. Observe the contrast between "the social scourge of all races..." handled by Soul and "the cement of civilization and progress", integrating and holding within law the lives of men and nations, and fore-shadowing the unity of being within Principle: the Word beginning to reflect the Christ.

Life

Until such unity is established there is no stability and no permanent blending of masculine and feminine qualities, no natural conjoining of these diverse elements, and the Science of Life would still seem to elude society.

The "demands of the affections" must be positive and permanent, rooted in Truth and Love.

Unselfed love enriches the nature. Through trials and tribulations Love supports the struggling heart.

1 existence by constant intercourse with those adapted to elevate it, should be the motive of society. Unity of 3 spirit gives new pinions to joy, or else joy's drooping wings trail in dust.

Spirit

Ill-arranged notes produce discord. Tones of the 6 human mind may be different, but they should be concordant in order to blend properly. Unselfish ambition, noble life-motives, and purity, —

9 these constituents of thought, mingling, constitute individually and collectively true happiness, strength, and

permanence.

There is moral freedom in Soul. Never contract the Soul 12 horizon of a worthy outlook by the selfish exaction of all another's time and thoughts. With additional joys, benevolence should grow more 15 The narrowness and jealousy, which would diffusive. confine a wife or a husband forever within four walls, will 18 not promote the sweet interchange of confidence and love; but on the other hand, a wandering desire for incessant amusement outside the home circle is a poor augury for 21 the happiness of wedlock. Home is the dearest spot on earth, and it should be the centre, though not the boundary, of the affections.

Principle 24

Said the peasant bride to her lover: "Two eat no more together than they eat separately." This is a hint that a wife ought not to court vulgar extravagance or stupid ease, because another supplies her wants. Wealth may obviate the necessity for toil or the chance for ill-nature in the marriage relation, but noth-30 ing can abolish the cares of marriage.

The subject is now considered from the standpoint of Spirit and in Christianity find its unfolding Genesis order. The text provides numerous examples of contrast and thereby illustrates the firmament concept of separation and no blending or mixing of opposites. There is but one reality.

A true and principled domestic economy in contrast with vulgar extravagance and stupid ease.

The above contrasts illustrate the demands of the Word as it reflects Christianity in the mutual relationship of marriage; and epitomize the chapter in the overall design.

L.ife As the Word reflects Science the text becomes more positive as it Science presents and interprets the differing duties and demands of this relationship.

Truth

Mutual compromises will often maintain a compact which might otherwise become unbearable. Man should not be required to participate in all the annoyances and 9 cares of domestic economy, nor should woman be expected to understand political economy. Fulfilling the different demands of their united spheres, their sympa- 12 thies should blend in sweet confidence and cheer, each partner sustaining the other, — thus hallowing the union of interests and affections, in which the heart finds peace 15 and home.

Tender words and unselfish care in what promotes the welfare and happiness of your wife will prove more salutary 18 in prolonging her health and smiles than stolid indifference or jealousy. Husbands, hear this and remember how slight a word or deed may renew the 21 old trysting-times.

SOUL.

After marriage, it is too late to grumble over incompati-Mind bility of disposition. A mutual understanding should 24 exist before this union and continue ever after, for deception is fatal to happiness.

Spirit

The nuptial vow should never be annulled, so long as 27 its moral obligations are kept intact; but the frequency of divorce shows that the sacredness of this relationship is losing its influence, and that fatal mistakes are undermining its foundations. Separation never should take place, and it never would, if both

CHRI Word

The text now counsels that "matrimony should never be entered into without a full recognition of its enduring obligations on both sides". Unselfed love in turn prepares the way for the self-immolation which is inseparable from life, in order that life may enter upon Life. To be permanent this must of necessity be reciprocal.

ruth

With increased confidence and unity and fulfilling their assumed responsibility, "each partner sustaining the other", the union is blessed and hallowed in ever increasing measure by the Christ, Truth.

Love

It is thus that "Trysting renewed" (M.H.) brings a sense of fulfilment on the human plane, preparatory to the higher concepts of relationships that obtain in the ultimate reality.

Spirit

"A mutual understanding should exist before (my italics) this CHRIST union... for deception is fatal to happiness": the starting point for Word a consideration of marriage from the standpoint of Soul.

Therefore maternal affection lives on under whatever difficulties.

Soul has infinite resources with which to bless mankind, 30 and happiness would be more readily attained and would be more secure in our keeping, if sought in Soul. Higher enjoyments alone can satisfy the cravings of immortal Soul

"The beautiful in character is also the good, welding indissolubly (my italics) the links of affection", all contributing to true identity.

From the *logic of events* we learn first that selfishness and impurity alone are fleeting, and second that "wisdom will ultimately put asunder what she hath not joined together". Observe here the element of spiritual rationality, and also the opposite of oneness.

Every valley of sin must be exalted, and every 9 mountain of selfishness be brought low, that the highway of our God may be prepared in Science. The offspring of heavenly-minded parents inherit more intellect, better 12 balanced minds, and sounder constitutions.

Spirit

If some fortuitous circumstance places promising children in the arms of gross parents, often these beautiful 15 children early droop and die, like tropical Propensities flowers born amid Alpine snows. If perchance they live to become parents in their turn, they may re- 18 produce in their own helpless little ones the grosser traits of their ancestors. What hope of happiness, what noble ambition, can inspire the child who inherits propensities 21 that must either be overcome or reduce him to a loath-some wreck?

Soul

Is not the propagation of the human species a greater 24 responsibility, a more solemn charge, than the culture of your garden or the raising of stock to increase your flocks and herds? Nothing unworthy of perpetuity should be 27 transmitted to children.

Principle

The formation of mortals must greatly improve to advance mankind. The scientific *morale* of marriage is 30 spiritual unity. If the propagation of a higher human species is requisite to reach this goal, then its material con-

"We cannot circumscribe happiness within the limits of personal sense". This passage is transitional to the next subject which considers marriage from the standpoint of Principle.

The whole subject is now considered from the standpoint of Prin-Christ PLE Mind ciple. We begin with the ascendency of good over evil, the spiritual over the animal, that the highway of God may be prepared in Science.

Now appears the inversion - Marginal Heading "Propensities inpirit herited". Fortuitous implies chance, accident, resulting disorder the opposite of divine order. The only alternative is to recognise man as the offspring of Spirit, that he inherits only good, and has Godgiven power to resist and overcome the lower propensities.

The responsibilities of marriage and parenthood are recognised in order to bring forth higher standards of true identity that reach out towards immortality.

"The scientific morale of marriage is spiritual unity". Webster reiple lates morale to moral principles, teaching or conduct... spirit of whole-hearted co-operation, attended by zeal and self-sacrifice. See dictionary for full definition.

Spiritual unity is the ideal, and all human thought and action should aspire to this ideal.

Thus, the pre-natal state of thought is vital in determining postnatal development and freedom from the involuntary operation of belief claiming the authority of law.

The divine government is irreversible. If the higher nature of man were or could be governed by the lower, divine law and order would have broken down. It is the office of Spirit so to demonstrate "the firmament" that the problem of opposites is forever solved. In Science man is the offspring of Spirit. The beautiful, good, and pure constitute his ancestry. Spirit is his primitive and ultimate source of being; God is his Father, and Life is the law of his being.

Principle

Civil law establishes very unfair differences between the 12 rights of the two sexes. Christian Science furnishes no precedent for such injustice, and civilization The rights mitigates it in some measure. Still, it is a of woman 15 marvel why usage should accord woman less rights than does either Christian Science or civilization.

Our laws are not impartial, to say the least, in their 18 discrimination as to the person, property, and parental claims of the two sexes. If the elective fran-Unfair dischise for women will remedy the evil with-crimination 21 out encouraging difficulties of greater magnitude, let us hope it will be granted. A feasible as well as rational means of improvement at present is the elevation of 24 society in general and the achievement of a nobler race for legislation, — a race having higher aims and motives.

If a dissolute husband deserts his wife, certainly the wronged, and perchance impoverished, woman should be allowed to collect her own wages, enter into business agreements, hold real estate, deposit funds, and own her children free from interference.

Soul

"In Science man is the offspring of Spirit. The beautiful, good, and pure constitute his ancestry". These in a primary sense therefore determine his identity in quality and quantity; and in a secondary sense provide the corrective law to all aggregated beliefs dormant in human ancestry.

Soul therefore is the natural, maintaining and sustaining, sinless and changeless status of his being; and Life the law of his being. Fatherhood is a quality of Life, and illustrates Life reflecting Soul con-

joined with man's identity.

This present age is witness to the discovery of Christianity in its CHRIST-Science as distinct from doctrinal belief, and God as the divine Prin- word ciple of the universe as distinct from the gods and mythologies of the ancients. This has already resulted in two profound yet correlated movements of world thought: the awakening of mankind from the sleep and dream of the ages; and the recognition of the rights of woman to fulfill her place in the progressive life of mankind. More progress and development in the natural and social sciences has taken place in the last hundred years than in the thousands of years of recorded history in the life of mankind.

This is due to the impact of the spiritual idea on the darkness of belief resulting in chemicalization and revolution in every walk of life, and amongst all peoples.

The text turns therefore to consider the rights of woman and the administration of the law within the meaning of justice and the operation of divine Principle.

Want of uniform justice is a crying evil caused by the selfishness and inhumanity of man. Our forefathers exercised their faith in the direction taught by the Apostle James, when he said: "Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father, is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world."

Pride, envy, or jealousy seems on most occasions to

be the master of ceremonies, ruling out primitive Christianity. When a man lends a helping hand to some noble woman, struggling alone with adversity, his wife should not say, "It is never well to interfere with your neighbor's business." A wife is sometimes debarred by a covetous domestic tyrant from spiring the ready aid her sympathy and charity would afford.

now exists. Honesty and virtue ensure the stability of
the marriage covenant. Spirit will ultimately claim its
own, — all that really is, — and the voices of physical
sense will be forever hushed.

Animal magnetism unseen and unrecognised by mankind in general and operating as pride, envy, jealousy—all elements of personal sense—would obscure and obstruct the nobler qualities of manhood and womanhood inseparable from a demonstrable Christianity. This inversion of Life in its fifth tone is indicated by the Marginal Heading "Benevolence hindered". The Christ in Christianity handles this adequately.

Experience should be the school of virtue, and human 1 Christ (contd) happiness should proceed from man's highest nature. May Christ, Truth, be present at every bridal altar to turn the water into wine and to give to human life an inspiration by which man's spiritual and eternal existence may be discerned.

If the foundations of human affection are consistent with progress, they will be strong and enduring. Divorces should warn the age of some fundamental error 9 Righteous in the marriage state. The union of the sexes suffers fearful discord. To gain Christian Science and its harmony, life should be more metaphysically regarded. 12

The broadcast powers of evil so conspicuous to-day show themselves in the materialism and sensualism of the age, struggling against the advancing 15 spiritual era. Beholding the world's lack of Christianity and the powerlessness of vows to make home happy, the human mind will at length demand a higher 18 affection.

There will ensue a fermentation over this as over many other reforms, until we get at last the clear straining of 21 truth, and impurity and error are left among the lees. The fermentation even of fluids is not pleasant. An unsettled, transitional stage is never 24 desirable on its own account. Matrimony, which was once a fixed fact among us, must lose its present slippery footing, and man must find permanence and peace in a more 27 spiritual adherence.

The mental chemicalization, which has brought conjugal infidelity to the surface, will assuredly throw off 30 this evil, and marriage will become purer when the scum is gone.

The subject is human happiness and human affection. Happiness Christ Mind proceeding from man's highest nature becomes co-incident with his discernment of man's spiritual and eternal existence. At this point of coincidence, Christ, Truth, turns the water into wine, the ideal man begins to appear - at least in degree, and pure thought rises to inspired thought. Observe the Marginal Heading "Blessing of Christ".

The fundamental error is found in the belief of a separate self- Christianity existence, man apart from his Maker and divided into two sexes. To restore harmony the oneness of being must be accepted as the starting point and as the only foundation of affection. Righteous foundations (M.H.).

Half a century ago there was no radio broadcasting as we know it now. Human invention has developed it out of all recognition compared with its early beginning. Today it is universal the world over and provides a remarkable illustration of the idea of generic man with unlimited possibilities for disseminating good. Hence the greater need to watch that its misuse becomes not a channel for organised evil in this advancing and scientific era. If we are true to our responsibility the appearing of generic man is irresistible.

Spirit

This fermentation may well be regarded as the opposite of the turning of water into wine. In this context it implies agitation, unrest, a form of mental chemicalization preparatory to change, wherein impurity and error are left among the lees — the sediment or dregs.

The scum gone, the pure wine of human character is then left free for redemption and progress. The paragraph illustrates the action of

Truth reflecting Spirit.

Thou art right, immortal Shakespeare, great poet of humanity:

Sweet are the uses of adversity; 3 Which, like the toad, ugly and venomous, Wears yet a precious jewel in his head.

Trials teach mortals not to lean on a material staff, a broken reed, which pierces the heart. We do not half remember this in the sunshine of joy and prosperity. Sorrow is salutary. Through great tribulation we enter the kingdom. Trials are proofs of God's care. Spiritual development germi-12 nates not from seed sown in the soil of material hopes, but when these decay, Love propagates anew the higher joys of Spirit, which have no taint of earth. Each suc-15 cessive stage of experience unfolds new views of divine goodness and love.

Amidst gratitude for conjugal felicity, it is well to re-18 member how fleeting are human joys. Amidst conjugal infelicity, it is well to hope, pray, and wait patiently on

divine wisdom to point out the path.

Husbands and wives should never separate if there Science Principle 21 is no Christian demand for it. It is better to await the logic of events than for a wife precipitately to leave her husband or for a husband to leave his wife. If one is better than the other, as must always be the case, the other pre-eminently needs good 27 company. Socrates considered patience salutary under such circumstances, making his Xantippe a discipline for his philosophy.

Sorrow has its reward. It never leaves us Life 30 The gold where it found us. The furnace separates the gold from the dross that the precious metal may

The salutary nature of sorrow enriches and purifies. "Through Soul great tribulation we enter the kingdom. Trials are proofs of God's care". The text now considers the joy that lies beyond the senses. These progressive stages of development and experience never lose sight of "the path" — the journey from sense to Soul.

The great spiritual fact in Science is the oneness of being that obtains throughout man and the universe.

This is demonstrated in human experience as unity, which is Prin- Science ciple ciple in evidence. Therefore if one were beset with what appears to be an insoluble problem it were well to wait on divine wisdom to point out the path, or "to await the logic of events".

If "the logic of events" precipitates a fiery experience we should Life not be dismayed. This very occurrence may well be the demand of "the fifth day", self-immolation, allowing the divine image to appear. The Gospels with reference to Christ Jesus use the symbol of "the cup" to denote the same type of experience — the willingness to lay down the moral concept. The gold and dross (M.H.).

be graven with the image of God. The cup our Father 1 hath given, shall we not drink it and learn the lessons He teaches?

When the ocean is stirred by a storm, then the clouds lower, the wind shrieks through the tightened shrouds, and the waves lift themselves into mountains. He answers bravely, but even the dauntless seaman is not 9 sure of his safety; nautical science is not equal to the Science of Mind. Yet, acting up to his highest understanding, firm at the post of duty, the mariner works on 12 and awaits the issue. Thus should we deport ourselves on the seething ocean of sorrow. Hoping and working, one should stick to the wreck, until an irresistible 15 propulsion precipitates his doom or sunshine gladdens the troubled sea.

Love

The notion that animal natures can possibly give force 18 to character is too absurd for consideration, when we remember that through spiritual ascendency our Lord and Master healed the sick, raised the dead, and commanded even the winds and waves to obey him. Grace and Truth are potent beyond all other means and methods.

The lack of spiritual power in the limited demonstration of popular Christianity does not put to silence the labor of centuries. Spiritual, not corporeal, consciousness is 27 needed. Man delivered from sin, disease, and death presents the true likeness or spiritual ideal.

LOVE

Systems of religion and medicine treat of physical pains 30 and pleasures, but Jesus rebuked the suffering from any such cause or effect. The epoch approaches when the

SCIEN Word The picture presented here depicts elementary latent error being stirred to its depths by Truth; yet, firmly holding on to Truth's supremacy despite such contrary evidence, victory is won and a higher concept of man appears: man in the divine likeness, or generic man.

Love is the power that heals the sick, raises the dead, and commands the wind and wave to bow before the supremacy of Truth. Such was the spiritual power and ascendancy fulfilled in Christ Jesus as he rose to the full stature of his manhood.

"God is working His purpose out" and despite lack of spiritual power in popular Christianity Love's labours are not lost. Man, redeemed and restored, is generic man beginning to appear and to present the spiritual ideal.

Systems of religion and medicine persist in postulating organic SCIENCE matter as the basis of being and the origin of life—life with its word pleasures and pains. Jesus rebuked this root error and demonstrated its falsity to the point of its disappearance. There is no nerve in Mind.

3 Basis of true fear of being thought ridiculous. They are religion slaves to fashion, pride, and sense. Sometime we shall learn how Spirit, the great architect, has created men and women in Science. We ought to weary of the fleeting and false and to cherish nothing which hinders our highest selfhood.

Jealousy is the grave of affection. The presence of mistrust, where confidence is due, withers the flowers of Eden and scatters love's petals to decay. Soul is immaculate and impeccable when understood and demon- Christ strated; Love as the Soul of all, is its own great cause and effect within the Infinite One; and through Science reflecting Christ annuls completely and finally the malpractice which would destroy the happiness of human relationship.

If agamogenesis were accepted as a theory applicable to human generation it would of necessity have to postulate life as organic and generation as a-sexual, not bi-sexual, and man therefore having a selfexistence of his own in origin, zenith, and subsequent decline into mortality.

This is a complete inversion of the oneness of being (Principle and its idea, one) and of man's divine origin and parentage in divine Life

Truth Thus it is that the real, ideal man appears in proportion sathefalse and material disappears. No longer to marry or to be "given in marriage" neither closes man's continuity nor his sense of increasing number in God's in-12 finite plan. Spiritually to understand that there is but one creator, God, unfolds all creation, confirms the Scriptures, brings the sweet assurance of no parting, no pain, 15 and of man deathless and perfect and eternal.

Love

If Christian Scientists educate their own offspring spiritually, they can educate others spiritually and not 18 conflict with the scientific sense of God's creation. Some day the child will ask his parent: "Do you keep the First Commandment? Do you have one God and creator, or 21 is man a creator?" If the father replies, "God creates man through man," the child may ask, "Do you teach that Spirit creates materially, or do you declare that 24 Spirit is infinite, therefore matter is out of the question?" Jesus said, "The children of this world marry, and are given in marriage: But they which shall be ac-27 counted worthy to obtain that world, and the resurrection from the dead, neither marry, nor are given in marriage."

Accretion is the opposite of unfoldment and would imply a separate self-existence based on matter, together with a process of adding to, by external addition. The process of accretion is by inference the first death; and its outcome, mortality is "the second death". As this process yields through enlightenment to unfoldment the Science of this translation will be understood and demonstrated as an office within "the divine infinite calculus" (S. & H. p. 520), and "the unbroken links of eternal, harmonius being will be spiritually discerned". (S. & H. p. 68).

Truth

The real, ideal man appears in proportion as the false and material Science disappears.

This prepares the way for advance beyond matter, and an ever ascending concept of all true relationship within the oneness of being.

Love

The chapter closes on the deeper meaning and implication of the First Commandment. The words of Christ Jesus stand for all time. Love in every walk of life is the liberator for, understood in its deeper sense, divine Love encircles and constitutes the universe and man.
