(Justice and recompense)

Error excludes itself from harmony. Sin is its own punishment.

o2oo Chapter 7: Physiology - 188:4

(Embryonic sinful thoughts)

The belief of sin, which has grown terrible in strength and influence, is an unconscious error in the beginning, - an embryonic thought without motive; but afterwards it governs the so-called man. Passion, depraved appetites, dishonesty, envy, hatred, revenge ripen into action, only to pass from shame and woe to their final punishment.

3000 Chapter 2: Atonement and Eucharist - 36:21

(Righteous retribution)

It is quite as impossible for sinners to receive their full punishment this side of the grave as for this world to bestow on the righteous their full reward. It is useless to suppose that the wicked can gloat over their offences to the last moment and then be suddenly pardoned and pushed into heaven, or that the hand of Love is satisfied with giving us only toil, sacrifice, cross-bearing, multiplied trials, and mockery of our motives in return for our efforts at well doing.

4000 Chapter 1: Prayer - 10:31-1

(Asking amiss)

Do you ask wisdom to be merciful and not to Amos 1:9,11 punish sin? Then "ye ask amiss." Without punishment, sin would multiply.

oolo Chapter 12: Christian Science Practice -405:5-19

(Mental conspirators)

Christian Science commands man to master the propensities, - to hold hatred in abeyance with kindness, to conquer lust with chastity, revenge with charity, and to overcome deceit with honesty. Choke these errors in their early stages, if you would not cherish an army of conspirators against health, happiness, and success. They will deliver you to the judge, the arbiter of truth against error. The judge will deliver you to justice, and the sentence of the moral law will be executed upon mortal mind and body. Both will be manacled until the last farthing is paid, - until you have balanced your account with God. "Whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap." The good man finally can overcome his fear of sin.

Section 2

Ezekiel 39:8,23

8 #Behold, it is come, and it is done, saith the Lord God; this is the day whereof I have spoken.

23 #And the heathen shall know that the house of Israel went into captivity for their iniquity: because they trespassed against me, therefore hid I my face from them, and gave them into the hand of their enemies: so fell they all by the sword.

(Retribution and remorse)

Sin will receive its full penalty, both for what it Section 3 is and for what it does.

4000 Chapter 1: Prayer - 6:11

(Pardon and amendment)

To cause suffering as the result of sin, is the means of destroying sin. Every supposed pleasure in sin will furnish more than its equivalent of pain, until belief in material life and sin is destroyed. To reach heaven, the harmony of being, we must understand the divine Principle of being.

oool Chapter 16: The Apocalypse - 569:14-28

(The robe of Science)

Alas for those who break faith with divine Science and fail to strangle the serpent of sin as well as of sickness! They are dwellers still in the deep darkness of belief. They are in the surging sea of error, not struggling to lift their heads above the drowning wave.

(Expiation by suffering)

What must the end be? They must eventually expiate their sin through suffering. The sin, which one has made his bosom companion, comes back to him at last with accelerated force. for the devil knoweth his time is short. Here the Scriptures declare that evil is temporal, not eternal. The dragon is at last stung to death by his own malice; but how many periods of torture it may take to remove all sin, must depend upon 3000 Chapter 2: Atonement and Eucharist sin's obduracy.

(Sin is punished)

The sin and error which possess us at the instant of death do not cease at that moment, but endure until the death of these errors. To be wholly spiritual, man must be sinless, and he becomes thus only when he reaches perfection.

Job 8:3

3 Doth God pervert judgment? or doth the Almighty pervert justice?

Psalm 89:14

14 Justice and judgment are the habitation of thy throne: mercy and truth shall go before thy face.

Amos 4:1

1 Hear this word, ye kine of Bashan, that are in the mountain of Samaria, which oppress the poor, which crush the needy, which say to their masters, Bring, and let us drink.

Amos 5:17,20

17 And in all vineyards shall be wailing: for I will pass through thee, saith the Lord.

oo3o Chapter 10: Science of Being - 290:23-27

(Justice and substitution)

Justice requires reformation of the sinner. Mercy cancels the debt only when justice approves.

(Evil let loose)

Whoever uses his developed mental powers like an escaped felon to commit fresh atrocities as opportunity occurs is never safe. God will arrest him. Divine justice will manacle him. His sins will be millstones about his neck, weighing him down to the depths of ignominy and death. The aggravation of error foretells its doom, and confirms the ancient axiom: "Whom the gods would destroy, they first make mad."

ooo2 Chapter 15: Genesis - 542:7

(Murder brings its curse)

Truth, through her eternal laws, unveils error. Truth causes sin to betray itself, and sets upon error the mark of the beast. Even the disposition he shall know them? for the ways of to excuse guilt or to conceal it is punished. The avoidance of justice and the denial of truth tend to perpetuate sin, invoke crime, jeopardize selfcontrol, and mock divine mercy.

oloo Chapter 8: Footsteps of Truth - 240:27

(Progress demanded)

In trying to undo the errors of sense one must pay fully and fairly the utmost farthing, until all error is finally brought into subjection to Truth. The divine method of paying sin's wages involves unwinding one's snarls, and learning from experience how to divide between sense and Soul.

oo3o Chapter 10: Science of Being - 291:28

(Day of judgment)

No final judgment awaits mortals, for the judgment-day of wisdom comes hourly and o400 Chapter 5: Animal Magnetism Unmasked - continually, even the judgment by which mortal man is divested of all material error. As for spiritual error there is none.

Section 4

Hosea 14:1,2,9

1 O Israel, return unto the Lord thy God; for thou hast fallen by thine iniquity.

2 Take with you words, and turn to the Lord: say unto him, Take away all iniquity, and receive us graciously: so will we render the calves of our lips.

9 Who is wise, and he shall understand these things? prudent, and the Lord are right, and the just shall walk in them: but the transgressors shall fall therein.

I Peter 4:1-3,7

1 Forasmuch then as Christ hath suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves likewise with the same mind: for he that hath suffered in the flesh hath ceased from sin;

4000 Chapter 1: Prayer - 5:3-6

(Sorrow and reformation)

Sorrow for wrong-doing is but one step towards reform and the very easiest step. The next and great step required by wisdom is the test of our sincerity, - namely, reformation.

oo3o Chapter 10: Science of Being - 327:1-24

(Conversion of Saul)

Reform comes by understanding that there is no abiding pleasure in evil, and also by gaining an affection for good according to Science, which reveals the immortal fact that neither pleasure nor pain, appetite nor passion, can exist in or of matter, while divine Mind can and does destroy the false beliefs of pleasure, pain, or fear and all the sinful appetites of the human mind.

(Image of the beast)

What a pitiful sight is malice, finding pleasure transgressions. in revenge! Evil is sometimes a man's highest conception of right, until his grasp on good

grows stronger. Then he loses pleasure in wickedness, and it becomes his torment. The way to escape the misery of sin is to cease sinning. There is no other way. Sin is the image of the beast to be effaced by the sweat of agony. It is a moral madness which rushes forth to clamor with midnight and tempest.

(Peremptory demands)

To the physical senses, the strict demands of Christian Science seem peremptory; but mortals are hastening to learn that Life is God, good, and that evil has in reality neither place nor power in the human or the divine economy.

(Moral courage)

Fear of punishment never made man truly honest. Moral courage is requisite to meet the wrong and to proclaim the right.

3000 Chapter 2: Atonement and Eucharist -35:30-4

(Final purpose)

The design of Love is to reform the sinner. If the sinner's punishment here has been insufficient to reform him, the good man's heaven would be a hell to the sinner. They, who know not purity and affection by experience, can never find bliss in the blessed company of Truth and Love simply through translation into another sphere.

Section 5

Psalm 51:1

1 Have mercy upon me, O God, according to thy lovingkindness: according unto the multitude of thy tender mercies blot out my

Psalm 130:3,4

3 If thou, Lord, shouldest mark iniquities, O Lord, who shall stand?

4000 Chapter 1: Prayer - 6:3

(Pardon and amendment)

Divine Love corrects and governs man. Men may pardon, but this divine Principle alone reforms the sinner. God is not separate from the wisdom He bestows. The talents He gives we must improve. Calling on Him to forgive our work badly done or left undone, implies the vain supposition that we have nothing to do but to ask pardon, and that afterwards we shall be free to repeat the offence.

0030 Chapter 10: Science of Being - 291:1

(Sin is punished)

The suppositions that sin is pardoned while unforsaken, that happiness can be genuine in the midst of sin, that the so-called death of the body frees from sin, and that God's pardon is aught but the destruction of sin, - these are grave mistakes. We know that all will be changed "in the twinkling of an eye," when the last trump shall sound; but this last call of wisdom cannot come till mortals have already yielded to each lesser call in the growth of Christian character. Mortals need not fancy that belief in the experience of death will awaken them to glorified being.

oo3o Chapter 10: Science of Being (PLATFORM) - 339:1

(- MORTAL MIND - Sin)

(-30- Divine pardon)

XXX. The destruction of sin is the divine method of pardon. Divine Life destroys death, Truth destroys error, and Love destroys hate. Being destroyed, sin needs no other form of forgiveness. Does not God's pardon, destroying any one sin, prophesy and involve the final destruction of all sin?

oo3o Chapter 10: Science of Being - 292:1

(Day of judgment)

When the last mortal fault is destroyed, then the final trump will sound which will end the battle of Truth with error and mortality; "but of that day and hour, knoweth no man." Here prophecy pauses. Divine Science alone can compass the heights and depths of being and reveal the infinite.

(Paean of jubilee)

For victory over a single sin, we give thanks and magnify the Lord of Hosts. What shall we say of the mighty conquest over all sin? A louder song, sweeter than has ever before reached high heaven, now rises clearer and nearer to the great heart of Christ; for the accuser is not there, and Love sends forth her primal and everlasting strain. Self-abnegation, by which we lay down

all for Truth, or Christ, in our warfare against error, is a rule in Christian Science. This rule clearly interprets God as divine Principle, - as Life, represented by the Father; as Truth, represented by the Son; as Love, represented by the Mother. Every mortal at some period, here or 18 1 - Embryonic sinful thoughts hereafter, must grapple with and overcome the mortal belief in a power opposed to God.

oloo Chapter 8: Footsteps of Truth - 242:6

(Spiritual baptism) Denial of the claims of matter is a great step towards the joys of Spirit, towards human freedom and the final triumph over the body.

3000 Chapter 2: Atonement and Eucharist -40:31

(Within the veil)

The nature of Christianity is peaceful and blessed, but in order to enter into the kingdom, the anchor of hope must be cast beyond the veil of matter into the Shekinah into which Jesus has passed before us; and this advance beyond matter must come through the joys and triumphs of the righteous as well as through their sorrows and afflictions. Like our Master, we must depart from material sense into the spiritual sense of being.

3000 Chapter 2: Atonement and Eucharist - 39:7 18 6 - Mockery of truth

(Mockery of truth)

We need "Christ, and him crucified." We must have trials and self-denials, as well as joys and victories, until all error is destroyed.

oloo Chapter 8: Footsteps of Truth - 251:24

(Mortal mind's disappearance)

This process of higher spiritual understanding improves mankind until error disappears, and
